

COMMON QUESTIONS

WHAT'S THE COST?

The total cost for summer ministry is \$350 per student. This includes lodging, meals, and all required training materials. We encourage summer missionaries to invite family & friends to partner financially in ministry. We'll help every step of the way, including with support-raising.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Any young person, ages 12 to early college, who has accepted Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior may apply.



WHERE IS CYIA HELD?

There are several locations involved. Pretraining will be held locally, likely in Murfreesboro. CYIA Training Week is at Linden Valley Camp (Linden, TN) & is an overnight camp. Ministry locations will be primarily in Rutherford, Wilson, or Marshall County, Monday thru Friday, with summer missionaries returning home each day.

WHAT IS CYIA?

Christian Youth in Action (CYIA) is exactly what it sounds like - Christian youth actively involved in taking the good news of the Gospel into the local community. There are two phases to the CYIA program: a training program and a mission trip.

THE TRAINING PROGRAM

Pretraining. Preparation for training camp begins locally. Students learn the basics of The Wordless Book, a simple tool for sharing the Gospel. They will also meet other CYIAers from the Middle Tennessee chapter as they prepare for training week together.

Training Week. At Linden Valley Camp, students will gather with other CYIA summer missionaries from across the state. Here, they'll learning how to teach in a 5-Day Club, a fun and engaging outreach designed to teach children ages 5-12 about Jesus and His love for them.

THE MISSION TRIP

Serve Locally. After CYIA Training Week, students will be *SENT*, spending several weeks leading 5-Day Clubs in their local community. Clubs are held Monday thru Friday in a variety of locations, including community centers, daycares, parks, or other safe locations.
